

LAST MEETING HIGHLIGHTS:

Our guest speaker was Tim Wall from DFES, who gave us a most interesting and informative talk on being prepared for the coming bushfire season.

Prepare, Act, Survive planning should include:

- Property assessment for bushfire risk
- Bushfire checklists and plans
- > Family 5 Minute Fire Chat to plan when to leave, where to go, and which way to go
- making a Calendar for preparing your property
- > an emergency kit for important items to take in the event of an evacuation.

Tim also informed us about the **EmergencyWA phone app**, which provides current emergency warnings. Tim provided written material which will also be available at the January meeting.

In the general meeting we had a comprehensive Councilors Report from Anthony Moir on the current status of City of Albany Coastal Hazard Mapping – with Community consultation to follow on 29 November at Albany Surf Club.

Kalgan Councillors Bill Hollingworth and newly-elected Emma Doughty answered questions from the floor, including on the following issues:

- Alison Hartman Gardens plans for upgrade of facilities
- > Albany Library renovation on schedule for March opening
- > Historical Collection currently in the Coop building, but to be located back at Library
- Old Visitor Centre building to house the new Wave Energy Project
- TransWA Bus station there are no plans to move this.
- Oyster Harbour Development Public Open Space there was discussion on matters raised by a resident of the new Oyster Harbour Estate. More on this later in the newsletter.

Your Progress Association has agreed to try and develop a channel for Community Consultation with the City of Albany Health Development, regarding planning for the Public Open Space so that it meets the needs of the community. Specifically, a dog exercise area featuring a dog waste station with a bin was requested, and this issue is now being pursued by LKBHPA.
