

### LAST MEETING HIGHLIGHTS:

We held our first swap meet on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> of July which turned out to be a very successful event with all available items successfully swapped and with good support from local people as well as some of the Denmark group that also attended this initial event. The attendees indicated they would like to see this event held regularly and this concept was taken up by your Committee.

### Our next community sponsored event will be on 7 September at Gomm Park Hall. This will be a Swap Meet, starting at 2 PM – see flier attached.

### SWAP MEET - Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> September, Gomm Park Hall commencing 2 PM.

This is a new initiative by the Association to sponsor a community event, using the Hall as a hub for community activities. The **Swap Meet** idea is for people to bring something to swap, e.g. fruit, vegetables, plants, cuttings, preserves, books, magazines, or any other item that is likely to be an attractive swap. This is a swap only, no buying or selling.

#### The simple rules are: to participate, you need to bring something to swap, and a gold coin donation. Everything will be set out on tables for inspection at 2pm, and at 2:30 PM swap commences.

You can walk around before 2.30, and look at what's on offer and decide what you would like to swap for. Anything that you bring that is not swapped must be taken home by the person who brought it.

This idea is patterned after the very successful and well attended regular swap meets at Denmark.

The other benefit is that people can socialise and get to meet one another, as well as being a means of communication with your Association.



For our 2<sup>nd</sup> swap meet we are asking for a gold coin donation for participants as your Association does not make any funds from holding these events but we need to hire the Gomm Park Hall on each occasion, the idea of the gold coin donation is just to offset the cost of the Hall hire.

Additional future swap meetings will be held for the balance of this year on the following dates Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> of October, Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> of November, and Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> December.

**MEMBER SURVEY:** results of the survey mailed out earlier in the year resulted in low numbers for all the suggested events however we have had some input from the OUTLOOK complex in Elizabeth Street through our committee member Simon Bairstow who is the manager at that facility. Many of the requested activities by individuals who returned the survey are held at THE OUTLOOK, Simon has raised the possibility of our members who are interested in the particular activity also being able to participate. We will notify interested members of events that are being held at the outlook when we are informed.

#### Long live you program

<u>The City Of Albany</u> together with Denmark and Mount Barker has initiated a tremendous program for seniors aged 60 or over. In Albany they have thrown open the entire facilities of the aquatics and leisure centre for all residents over 60, all at no cost. This means free use of their gym, with supervision if required, as well as many other activities including the pool and specialised classes: two examples are Fit Ball and Zumba.

Anyone who is not aware of this great initiative just needs to register at ALAC and you will be given a tag that you can use as often as you like, the program runs all of August till the end of September and then a further discounted offer will be made to those who wish to continue with some or all of the activities at the centre. This is a great initiative by the council to help senior citizens to exercise have fun and meet new people, to give some idea of the value a full year's membership with access to all the facilities at a current discounted pension rate is valued at \$750 per year.
